

Gaelic Game Vetting Role rationale

Role	Rationale
Artane Band Tutor working with under 18s	Tutors providing training to band members under 18 years old. In addition, supervising band members under 18 years old.
Caretaker in care and supervision of children	Caretaker at GAA grounds whose role includes the care and supervision of children attending the ground for training, GAA events or matches. In cases where children arrive before the coach, the caretaker is responsibility for the childrens care and supervision until the coaches arrive.
Chaperone working with children	Chaperones are volunteers other than coaches who provide supervision of children attending training or matches
Coach or Manager with players 18 years and under	Providing coaching in the skills of Gaelic games to persons under 18 years old.
Cúl Camp Coaching children 18 and under	Providing coaching in the skills of Gaelic games to persons under 18 years old.
First aider providing treatment to children and vulnerable adults	Providing first aid to an injured child or vulnerable person
Host Family Child Accommodation	Providing accommodation to children attending GAA events
Match Official in care and supervision of children	Match Official whose role includes the care and supervision of children participating in matches.
Mentoring players 18 years and under	Providing coaching and mentoring in the skills of Gaelic games to persons under 18 years old.
Physiotherapist providing treatment to children and vulnerable adults	Physiotherapist providing treatment to children and/or vulnerable persons
Scór tutor working with under 18s	Scór Tutors providing training to participants under 18 years old. In addition, supervising participants in scór under 18 years old
Supervisor working with children or vulnerable persons	Supervisors are volunteers other than coaches who provide supervision of children attending camps, training or matches and who as part of designated programmes provide a Supervisory role in the provision of services for vulnerable persons

Club or County Childrens Officer	Club/County Children’s Officers promote the child centered ethos at Club and County level while consulting with young people. The Children’s Officer is also the relevant person as per the Children First Act 2015.
Photographer of childrens games	Photographer is the person that attends underage games under the direction and permission of the club for the sole purpose of taking photographs of the underage activity and for uploading any recorded images by permission to club website and other club social media platforms while also maintaining such social media services for use by children and adults
Camp Assistant with children under 18	Assisting coaches in the provision of coaching in the skills of Gaelic games to persons under 18 years old.
Assistant GAA Covid 19 community initiative	This role is to carry out work or activities which consists of the care (including the provision of personal social services and essential domestic services) of vulnerable persons in response to Covid-19 outbreak.
